Work Group Goals, Objectives and Actions: The Mid-Atlantic Ocean Planning Committee's Non-Consumptive Recreation working group is conducting activities in continuation and support of the 2016 Mid-Atlantic Ocean Action Plan's Section 2.4.7: Non-Consumptive Recreation, Objective 7, which states, "Account for the importance of nearshore and offshore non-consumptive recreational uses, and their local and regional economic contributions in the Mid-Atlantic; and in the management of other ocean uses and resources, consider impacts on non-consumptive recreational activities (e.g., surfing, boating, whale watching, birding, diving)." The Non-Consumptive Recreation work group seeks to identify, characterize, and share information about measures to maintain the value of important non-consumptive recreational areas and the activities they sustain to users and the Mid-Atlantic economy.

ACTIVITY 1 - Create a Mobile Application for the Mid-Atlantic region for recreators. MARCO staff and the Work Group Lead have been in discussion with MyCoast.org to develop a MARCO page that would track recreational activities across the five states. Data that would be collected would include, but not be limited to, the "report" (photo of the recreational activity), location (latitude and longitude), time, temperature of the water, salinity, and tide state.

Expected Completion Date: December 2024; On going

A1 Progress Period: July-December 2024

MARCO has contracted with MyCoast.Org to create a regional MARCO page. A mock up of the page will be presented at a work group meeting planned for January 2025. The page is expected to collect information on how people use coastal resources for recreation purposes. "Recreation" could include, but is not limited to, swimming, boating, beach-going, recreational fishing, surfing, shelling, and paddle boarding. MyCoast collects background information that includes latitude and longitude, water temperature, salinity, tide state, and weather. It is expected that a social media campaign will also be developed when the page goes live in Q1 of 2025.

ACTIVITY 2 - Identify and map data illustrating coastal recreation and tourism (boat launches, water trails, etc.) for the MARCO Data Portal

Expected Completion Date: Ongoing
